23rd World Scout Jamboree Kicks off on July 28! Platinum Sponsor AEON to Hold Workshop for Participants

Aeon Co., Ltd. will host a workshop to provide a training ground for participants in the 23rd World Scout Jamboree (23 WSJ), an international camping convention, organized by the World Organization of the Scout Movement, held between July 28 to August 8 in Kirara-hama, Yamaguchi Prefecture.

Aeon, a platinum sponsor, has offered its cooperation and support via its nationwide network of the Group stores to the "National Orizuru (paper crane) Caravan" hosted by the Scout Association of Japan that took place ahead of the jamboree. Through the event, participants folded as many as 90,000 paper cranes dedicated to promote peace. Representative Scouts from each National Scout Organization are scheduled to present these cranes at the Hiroshima Peace Memorial Park during the Hiroshima Peace Memorial Ceremony on August 6.

In addition, the 23 WSJ marks the first time that official neckerchiefs made from Fairtrade certified cotton products (developed by Aeon Topvalu Co. Ltd.) will be worn by all of the approximately 34,000 participating scouts at the event.

Through these initiatives, Aeon, along with the participating scouts, will contemplate the 23 WSJ's three themes of "peace," "the environment" and "development."

[Aeon's initiatives at the 23 WSJ]

-Donation of official neckerchiefs

Aeon's products made from Fairtrade certified cotton (Senegalese) developed by Aeon Topvalu Co. Ltd. was selected as the official neckerchief in keeping with Aeon and the Scout Association of Japan's shared principles. It marked the first time that Fairtrade products were used in the production of World Scout Jamboree official neckerchiefs. During the two-week event, all the 30,000 scouts will wear the neckerchiefs at all times and share experiences with their counterparts from all over the world during the quadrennial event.

<u>-90,000 folded paper cranes made at the "National Orizuru Caravan" to be presented at the Hiroshima Peace Memorial Park</u>

"National Orizuru Caravan" have primarily been held sequentially at the Group commercial facilities in 47 prefectures from April 19, 100 days prior to the launch of the jamboree. At the Caravan, Aeon planned a variety of projects to broaden children's knowledge by setting up booths enabling them to, for example, fold paper cranes to promote peace and experience Boy Scout activities.

The Caravan has finally arrived at Aeon Town Hofu (Yamaguchi Prefecture) on June 28, a month prior to the opening of the jamboree. The total number of paper cranes folded during the "National Orizuru Caravan" campaign reached 90,000. Participants in the jamboree are scheduled to present these paper cranes to the Hiroshima Peace Memorial Park during the event.

At this event held in Kirara-hama, Ajisu, Yamaguchi City in 2015, participants from some 150 countries and regions from all over the world, will be deployed and stay with families in various areas throughout Japan and tour Japan. They will be able to learn about Japan's cutting-edge science and technology, traditions, performing arts, attractive culture as well as engage in international cooperation, form partnerships and so forth. Through these experiences, participants will deepen their awareness of the relationship between themselves and the external world, how much they are blessed, challenges, etc. This is the second jamboree held in Japan and the first in 44 years, which was held in 1971.
