Presentation of Emergency Disaster Relief Donation for People Affected by the Typhoon in the Philippines

Aeon will offer an emergency disaster relief donation to help people affected by the destructive typhoon (Typhoon Bopha) that ravaged the southern Philippines.

Typhoon Bopha hit Mindanao Island located in the southern part of the Philippines on Tuesday, December 4, causing flooding, landslides, and other severe damage in Cagayan de Oro, Iligan, and nearby cities. According to local media, as many as 5.4 million residents were affected by the typhoon as of Monday, December 10. Typhoon Bopha has taken hundreds of lives and forced many thousands of people to take refuge in evacuation centers. People who have not been able to find refuge in the centers are forced to sleep outside.

The water has not subsided in many of the affected areas, further hampering recovery efforts. Banana farming, the main industry in the area, has also been severely disrupted.

In response to this catastrophic disaster, Aeon will offer an emergency disaster relief donation to the Philippine Embassy in Japan to support the country's reconstruction efforts. The Aeon 1% Club made similar donations to the Philippine Embassy when typhoons hit the country in 2009 and 2011.
