Presenting Donations to Support the Construction of Schools in Myanmar

Aeon will donate a total of 43,786,520 yen to the Japan Committee for UNICEF (UNICEF Japan) on Wednesday, December 26, 2012. Half of the donation was raised from customers under the Myanmar School Construction Support Campaign and the other half was contributed by the Aeon 1% Club.

In the Republic of the Union of Myanmar (hereinafter, "Myanmar"), many primary schools suffer from a shortage of classrooms and students in different grades often study in shared classrooms without partitions. Under partnership with UNICEF Japan, Aeon is collecting donations over three years starting this year to support the construction of schools in Myanmar with the aim of providing a better study environment for children.

To support the construction of schools in Myanmar, approximately 7,000 stores and offices throughout Japan, including the Aeon Group's GMS store "Aeon," food supermarket "Maxalu" and convenience store "MINISTOP," collected donations. Moreover, the Aeon 1% Club, which comprises major Aeon Group companies, donated an amount equal to that generated from Aeon's customers and employees. Through UNICEF Japan, the donations from customers and employees combined with those from the Aeon 1% Club will be used as funds to support the construction of 30 primary schools over three years, as well as to train teachers.

Famous personalities Ms. Shoko Yasuda (singer), Mr. Hiroyuki Tomita (gymnast) and Ms. Kotono Tanaka (rhythmic gymnast) will attend the presentation ceremony as well as the opening ceremony (to be held in March 2013) of a school that was constructed using the funds offered through the Myanmar School Construction Support Campaign. After the opening ceremony, all those who cooperated in the campaign, including the famous personalities listed above, will spend time with children in Myanmar singing and playing sports.

Through the cooperation of customers and other supporters, Aeon has so far built a total of 346 schools in Cambodia, Nepal, Laos and Vietnam.

Aeon will continue to work together with its customers through various support initiatives to deliver a "future with dreams" to children, who will become the leaders of the next generation.
