1,600 volunteers to plant 24,000 mangrove trees Third Jakarta Tree-planting to be Held on Sunday, August 25

The Aeon Environmental Foundation (Takuya Okada, Chairman of the Foundation and Honorary Chairman and Advisor of Aeon Co., Ltd.; hereinafter, "the Foundation") will implement third tree-planting activity in Jakarta, the capital of the Republic of Indonesia (hereinafter, "Indonesia"), on Sunday, August 25.

In Indonesia, where the economy is growing steadily, mangroves and other trees that act as a tide-water control forest are dying under the influence of the rapid development of the coastal areas, posing a serious environmental problem. Amid this threat, the Foundation launched a three-year project in 2011 to plant mangroves in the marshland in the northern part of Jakarta in order to protect the highway and nearby residences from floods and other possible disasters as well as to restore lush greenery to the coastal area. Together with a total of 2,700 volunteers, the Foundation has planted 39,000 mangroves in the last two years.

This year, the third and final round of the project, a planned total of about 1,600 volunteers will plant about 24,000 mangroves. The team will include Japanese and local volunteers as well as high school students from six countries (China, Indonesia, Japan, Malaysia, Thailand, and Vietnam) who will be attending the Aeon Asia Eco-leaders forum held in Indonesia around the same time.

The total number of trees planted by the Foundation and through the Aeon Hometown Forests in which trees are planted on-site at Aeon stores in cooperation with local customers will reach 10,000,000 this year. Aeon will continue planting trees in order to pass this priceless, beautiful planet onto our children and their future.

Aeon is implementing a wide range of CSR programs besides tree-planting

(1) Teenage Ambassadors Program

The program, started in 1990, is an international exchange project aiming for an international mutual understanding between the youth. In 2002, 24 high school students in Jakarta visited Japan. As the latest program, 20 students of each country made a mutual visit to promote exchanges.
