## - To discuss actual issues

Students will learn about and discuss environmental issues under a specific theme that features the host country's social situation. Having the participants think about actual issues will hopefully help make the issues more real to them, and ultimately encourage them to take positive action.

## - To focus on common theme by both high school and university students

Both high school and university level groups will conduct discussions under a common theme, each according to their level of discourse and communicative capabilities. The high school program will focus on figuring out how to provoke awareness about the chosen issue, while the university program will discuss explicit solutions for the issue.

- To foster collaboration through the exchange between youths from countries facing environmental issues
All of the participants are from countries with environmental issues stemming from economic growth, and the
exchange between these youths will hopefully foster an understanding of difference in values and a relationship
of mutual cooperation in solving their respective issues.

This year, students from six countries—China, Indonesia, Japan, Malaysia, Thailand, and Vietnam—will learn about and discuss garbage-related issues in Indonesia, and the ideas compiled in each program will be proposed to the government in Jakarta.

Aeon will continue to nurture environmentally conscious individuals through international exchange in order to create "A Future of Dreams."

### About Aeon's CSR activities in Indonesia

Aeon is implementing a wide range of CSR programs besides tree-planting

(1)Teenage Ambassadors Program

The program, started in 1990, is an international exchange project aiming for an international mutual understanding between the youth. In 2002, 24 high school students in Jakarta visited Japan. As the latest program, 20 students of each country made a mutual visit to promote exchanges.

(2)Aeon Scholarship Program

Since 2007, Aeon has supported Indonesian students studying in Japan through Aeon Scholarship Program. From last year, we also support local Indonesian students studying in Indonesia.

(3) Jakarta Tree-planting

The Aeon Environmental Foundation launched a three-year project in 2011 to plant mangroves in the marshland in the northern part of Jakarta Together with a total of 2,700 volunteers, the Foundation has planted 39,000 mangroves in the last two years.
