Aeon to Hold Third Myanmar Yangon Tree planting on July 18 3,000 volunteers plant 24,000 trees over three years

Aeon Environmental Foundation (Chairman: Takuya Okada, Honorary Chairman and Advisor, Aeon Co., Ltd.) will hold the Myanmar Yangon tree planting activity on July 18 around the Pyugyi Reservoir located in the suburbs of Yangon, Republic of the Union of Myanmar.

Situated near the tree planting site, Pyugyi Reservoir is a source of domestic water for Yangon. In recent years, however, forest areas around the reservoir have been deforested for wooden living materials, which has weakened the forest's watershed conservation function.

In order to reforest the area and ensure the reservoir can be used sustainably as a water resource, the Foundation launched the three-year Myanmar Yangon tree planting project in 2013 in collaboration with Myanmar's Ministry of Environmental Conservation and Forestry. This year, the third year of the project, a total of about 1,000 volunteers from both Myanmar and Japan will plant about 10,000 indigenous native trees. With this year's tree planting, the cumulative total of planted trees will be over 24,000.

This year, the Foundation has held tree planting activities in Vietnam (Hanoi), Cambodia (Phnom Penh), and Atsuma-cho, Hokkaido Prefecture. Further events are also planned in Urayasu City, Chiba Prefecture, and Aya-cho, Miyazaki Prefecture.

Aeon will continue its tree planting projects in and outside Japan aiming to deliver a lush natural environment with clean water and abundant greenery for the youth of the next generation.
